Colossians 3:1-14

The Apostle Paul taught that how we dress is a reflection on how we ______. But he was talking about something other than physical clothing. In Colossians 3, God says that you have been raised with Christ, who is at the right hand of the Father, and your life is now _____ with Christ in God. Eph. 2:6 he said it even more plainly: “God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the _____ in Christ Jesus.”

That we “___” raised up and seated with Christ in the heavenly realms is stunning. God’s _____ perspective sees you “in Christ” and that is a _____ fact. God knows that if you could see that, it would radically change life. Our problem is that the world, dominated by the evil one, wants to keep you from seeing who you _____ and where your real life is in Christ.
