Following Christ in an Upside-Down World Luke 6:17-31

When Jesus' first followers heard His sermon recorded in Luke 6,
they must have felt that Jesus was turning their world
that what they had always believed was right side
up was actually
Jesus' sermon described what living in the kingdom is meant to look
<u> </u>
like. As King and Ruler, He alone can the kingdom as it
really is. The way we and our world is upside down
compared to the way He sees it. In almost every case, what we see
or think we know or should do, if not guided by God's and
by God's, is going to be wrong.
Jesus warns His followers that if we follow Him, we must let Him turn our world to see it as it really is and respond to it as He us to. Otherwise, the world's natural predator will overtake and us every time.
Jesus turns us upside down to show how we should see
and to our situation as heirs of the kingdom. He says,
"Do you see yourself as hindered, or with a hunger that goes
unsatisfied. Do people treat you badly? Don't think it's a bad thing
and cry about it! Your reward! It's!
Then, Jesus turns our world right-side up to show us how we should
see and to them since we are heirs of the kingdom.
He says, "When people and you, you'll feel like hating
them and hurting them But things are upside down. Respond
to evil with The people who hate and mistreat you aren't so
different from you. They need grace and forgiveness
that you have received from the Father and from me. Treat them the
way want to be treated, with patience and understanding and
love and forgiveness—the way treated you."
We have our instructions for flying right in an upside-down world.
Seek the of Christ who sees things right-side up by living by
His and listening to His voice.
