How is the Church like an Arch? Colossians 1:9-14 & 21-29

The main reason people avoid truly engaging in a local church is this: a withered, immature, and understanding of the Godgiven importance of the church and of the we are called to do our faith together rather than separately.
Paul's statement about the importance of the church gathered and sharing together is this: "so that we may present everyone in Christ." The church scattered is on mission to bring people to Christ. Gathered, our purpose is to encourage one another to toward in Christ.
This text outlines the ways in which Paul and we ourselves can be involved in helping present everyone fully mature in Christ. The first and most important way is continual Praying for one another is ultimately an acknowledgement that meaningful maturity in Christ is a work of in our lives.
A 2nd way we help one another mature is what Paul calls " for you." Suffering is the way Christ accomplished His greatest work, so His continued work will require some suffering by His —us. Being willing to suffer for the sake of one another, even the one causing the suffering, is a gift of that helps others to mature.
A 3 rd way of contributing to the maturing of one another is one another. The church that truly helps toward the goal of presenting everyone fully mature in Christ is the one that challenges its congregation to serve, not to, to more than they receive, and to even more than they are loved.
Finally, the text mentions the things we would expect to aid one another in maturity: ", and, and everyone with all wisdom." Learn, proclaim, encourage, and teach when you can. You'll mature and help others to as well.
