## Becoming God's Masterpiece

1 Peter 2:22-2:12
Our text today describes what $\qquad$ when He looks at us, His church. The description begins in verse 4. The cornerstone-the first stone laid in place from which all other lines of the building were set-is Jesus. He alone sets the direction and dimensions of all the other walls and structures of this building. We always $\qquad$ our lives and plans after Him. The question for Christians and every church is: "Does it look like what Jesus $\qquad$ or $\qquad$ ?"

But we are stones in this spiritual house too. Our purpose is to be "A holy $\qquad$ ." Like priests, we help people find God's
$\qquad$ for their sins by "offering $\qquad$
to God." This is a beautiful picture of sharing the $\qquad$ with the lost. But we also act as priests for $\qquad$ , helping brothers and sisters find God's fresh $\qquad$ cleansing and
$\qquad$ (See Gal. 6:1 \& James 5:16).
In verse 9 , he returns to his description: "You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession," God's special possession - God $\qquad$ us, His church, so $\qquad$ _.
1 Peter 1:22 describes how we cooperate with God in this. We live by the $\qquad$ of the Word of God - Love one another deeply, from the heart. Another way of saying it is to love even when you must $\qquad$ to do it.
To cooperate with God in becoming the church He see requires a love that looks like that-a willingness to dig down deep to rescue the $\qquad$ or to rescue our $\qquad$ and $\qquad$ who may have fallen. It is never to decide that someone is in _____ to keep shoveling to rescue them-never gone $\qquad$ that we quit trying to bring them back. This is, in fact, the work of a holy priesthood.
I wish we could all look around and see God's finished product. We're still an $\qquad$ . But try to be $\qquad$ with each other. God isn't finished with us yet. We're still becoming His
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
