Jesus' Parable of the Talents teaches us the following about stewardship. We are God's servants, and He has us with His wealth. We have different gifts but are all for the kingdom. Some believers put what God has given them to work. Some do not. There is great for those who invest heavily in our Master's kingdom. Christians who are not generous with their God-given resources don't their master. A Christian's failure to give generously to the mission of Christ is not a financial management problem but a and problem.
In the parable, Jesus uses a phrase that places emphasis on the of the Master of the servants. Furthermore, the word for wealth is based on the word for "being" or "existence." He was entrusting everything that to them. That is what our Lord has done regarding you and me. He has entrusted to us the about that which is His life—the thing He gave up His life for on the cross—the message of the That says something about how He sees you.
Everything we have is the Lord's to give and take. You are part of God's kingdom and have been given the gifts, talents, resources, and finances that you have because God and trusts your for Him—that you will act in His best interest.
To be a good steward is to what little we have and place it at the Master's disposal for His purposes. We each must ask the question, "Will I be the servant whom the master invites to share in His, or the one to whom the master has to say, "There is something with your heart and soul."
