

***Don't Be Foolish***  
***Psalm 8:1-6 & 14:1-3***

Psalms 8 and 14 present a contrast. Psalm 8 references God's grand \_\_\_\_\_ and hope for humanity while Psalm 14 acknowledges that \_\_\_\_\_ people have rejected God and His \_\_\_\_\_ for their lives.

In Psalm 8, we see an internal contrast between the \_\_\_\_\_ of God and the natural \_\_\_\_\_ of human beings. David writes that the \_\_\_\_\_ of creation is a testament to His majesty, and His majesty is also seen in the \_\_\_\_\_ of His capacity. He displays His power through powerless things. Little is much when God is in it.

Psalm 8 poses an important question: "What is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?" Of all the majesty of the creation, God's \_\_\_\_\_ rests with human beings. God has purposefully assigned humans a unique and special place in His creation. Though humans appear to be small, insignificant parts of God's creation, God has assigned them a unique and inspiring \_\_\_\_\_. Of all His creation, God has \_\_\_\_\_ offered us the role of serving Him, crowned with glory and honor, as \_\_\_\_\_ of all He has made.

When David wrote, "The fool says in his heart, there is no God," he wouldn't comprehend that someone believes \_\_\_\_\_. To say in your heart, "there is no God," is the stubborn and foolish declaration that, though there is a God, you don't \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_ Him or His grace; that you \_\_\_\_\_ His plan and purpose for your life; that you will go it \_\_\_\_\_.
